System requirements

- 1x HDMI display device, such as a monitor or projector, with
- 1x HDMI video source device, such as a computer, with cabling
- 1x USB port (power)
- 2x HDMI cables (For display device and video source device)

About this product

When a video source is connected to a display, EDID information is shared between devices to ensure optimal video performance.

However, if you are using a third party device, such as a video extender, between your source and display, the EDID information may not pass through correctly.

The emulator lets you clone or emulate the EDID settings from your display and deliver it to your video source to ensure proper signaling between your devices.

EDID cloning

To clone (copy) the EDID settings from your display:

1. If your video source is a computer system, set the mode switch on the EDID emulator to PC mode.

If your video source is consumer electronics equipment such as a Blu-ray[™] or DVD player, set the mode switch on the EDID emulator to A/V mode.

2. If your video source is HDMI, use the included screw driver to set dip switches 1 through 6 in the OFF position (down).

If your video source is DVI (with an HDMI adapter) set dip switches 1 through 5 in the OFF position (down), while dip switch 6 is set in the ON position (up).

- 3. Use the included screwdriver, to set the rotary dial on the EDID emulator to position 1.
- 4. Connect the USB power cable to the Power port on the EDID emulator and to a USB power source.
- 5. Connect an HDMI cable (not included) to your display device and to the HDMI output port on the EDID emulator.

- Press and hold the program button on the EDID emulator until the **Status** LED starts to flash green. When you release the program button, the LED will then flash green and red alternately, indicating that the EDID emulator is actively copying the display's EDID settings.
- 7. When the **Status** LED lights blue, the EDID copy process has successfully completed.
- 8. Disconnect the EDID emulator from your display and reconnect your display to the video output on the third-party equipment that is causing the disruption.
- 9. Connect an HDMI cable (not included) to your video source and to the HDMI input port on the EDID emulator.
- 10. Connect an HDMI cable (not included) to the EDID emulator's HDMI output port and to the video input port on the third-party equipment that is causing the disruption.
- 11. Verify the signal has been corrected by viewing your display.

Note: if your video source provides enough power through the HDMI port, it isn't necessary to reconnect a USB power source once the emulator is connected to the source. However, if the emulator does not power up when it's connected to the source, you must connect the EDID emulator to a USB power source using the included USB power cable.
