Chronic effects:
In a study in rats by chronic inhalation exposure to a typical toner, a mild to moderate degree of lung fibrosis was observed in $92 \%$ of the rats in the high concentration $\left(16 \mathrm{mg} / \mathrm{m}^{3}\right)$ exposure group, and a minimal to mild degree of fibrosis was noted in $22 \%$ of the animal in the middle $\left(4 \mathrm{mg} / \mathrm{m}^{3}\right)$ exposure group. But no pulmonary change was reported in the lowest $\left(1 \mathrm{mg} / \mathrm{m}^{3}\right)$ exposure group, the most relevant level to potential human exposures.
